NOTE: Familiarize yourself with this story. Study the supplemental Scripture and make notes on, but do NOT read from, these pages. To reinforce that these ideas are not your own, hold your Bible as you tell the story.

Have you said something, the right thing, and gotten in trouble anyway? How did you react? Let's see what happens to Peter as he continues to run the race.

Peter and John had been at the temple. They went to pray and healed a lame man in the process. Many people were amazed. They believed and followed the teachings of Jesus. But others came up to Peter and John who were not pleased with what they had been teaching. These men didn't believe that Jesus had risen from the dead and they certainly didn't believe that His resurrection meant that those who follow Him will one day be resurrected to spend forever with Him. These men were leaders at the temple. These men had studied the Scriptures, but they failed to see Jesus in the words that they knew so well.

Because they didn't like what had been said, the temple leaders had Peter and John arrested. They left them in jail overnight. The next day, the rulers and the leaders and the teachers of the law met together. They had Peter and John brought before them. They wanted an explanation for what Peter and John had been teaching and doing, as if they had said or done something wrong.

Peter, who was filled and controlled by the Holy Spirit, said, "Are you asking us to explain our actions today? Do you want to know why we were kind to a disabled man? Are you asking how he was healed? Then listen to this, you and all the people of Israel! You nailed Jesus Christ of Nazareth to the cross. But God raised him from the dead. It is through Jesus' name that this man stands healed in front of you." (Acts 4:9-10 NirV) Peter explained that these people had rejected the One they had been waiting for, the One God had promised - Jesus. Peter told them, "You can't be saved by believing in anyone else. God has given us no other name under heaven that will save us." (Acts 4:12 NirV)

The leaders saw how bold Peter and John were. They were just

Application

“Anyone who belongs to Christ Jesus and wants to live right will have trouble from others.” (2 Timothy 3:12 CEV) It’s only right to get into trouble when we’ve done something wrong. How would you react to being punished for doing the right thing?

Peter and John responded in a way that showed everyone around them that they had spent time with Jesus. Do you know Jesus? Have you given control of your life to Him? Do you follow Him? There is no other name under heaven that will save you! Will you accept the gift of life that He offers you today?

Don’t you want to react like Peter and John when you are scolded for doing the right thing? Spend time with Jesus today. Read His Word, the Bible, and study it. Talk to Him in prayer. Pray for boldness to say the right thing - all the time.

5. What was their answer? (We have to speak about the things we have seen and heard.)
6. How did the believers respond when Peter and John were released? (They prayed for boldness to continue sharing about Jesus.)

Activities

Memory Verse Activity - Review the memory verse until your students are familiar with it and can say it on their own. Then, play “Gossip.” Instruct your students to sit in a circle. Pick a student to begin and encourage the student to think of something God has done. Have them whisper to the second student, who whispers to the third student, and so on. Give each student a chance to share.

Make invitations. Be creative! Encourage your students to include something from the story, something they have learned about Jesus. Make visits with your students to those who do not come to church.

Look at Galatians 6:9, 2 Thessalonians 3:13, and Hebrews 12:3. Discuss their application for today’s lesson and for our lives.

Play “H-O-R-S-E,” the basketball game but spell out “B-O-L-D-N-E-S-S” instead.

Sing “Be Bold.” Talk about boldness. Look it up in the dictionary. Encourage your students to pray for boldness when sharing Christ with others.

Discuss Philippians 4:5-8. It is much easier to disagree angrily with someone than to be gentle. Talk about practical ways to “Let everyone know how gentle you are” (Philippians 4:5 NIV) while still speaking out boldly for Christ.
