

Sunday Teacher's Lesson for Children

Life of Christ

Jesus is alive!

Luke 22:68-24:12

Younger Verse

God showed us how much He loved us. Romans 5:8

Older Verse

God showed how much He loved us by having Christ die for us, even though we were sinful.
Romans 5:8 (CEV)

Welcome Time

Greet each child with a hug and tell them how glad you are to see them. Ask them if they have ever gotten to see someone that they hadn't seen in a long time. Ask them to describe how excited they were when they saw the friend again. Explain that today's lesson is about some exciting news!

Bible Study Time

*Please note: This portion of the lesson is given to help in teaching the lesson. Please read through the story and read it in the Bible. Do **NOT** read from this piece of paper. Instead, make a note sheet and place it next to the story in the Bible.*

Remember last week, What happened in our lesson? (Wait for answers) Remember how men arrested Jesus and took Him to be judged. Jesus' friend, Peter, was afraid. He followed Jesus, but did not get close to Him. Peter stayed out in the courtyard while Jesus was inside.

Jesus was taken to a judge. This dishonest judge asked Jesus if He were the Son of God. Jesus told him that He was. This angered the judge. The people decided that Jesus must die because they thought He was telling a lie and cursing God.

Early Friday morning, all the leaders took Jesus to the governor named Pilate. He asked Jesus several questions. Jesus told him that he was the King of the Jews and would not answer any other questions. This surprised Pilate.

Then Pilate sent Jesus to a man named Herod. Herod had been wanting to meet Jesus because he had heard many stories about Him. Herod could not see any reason for Jesus to die either.

Pilate talked to the accusers. He explained that Jesus had done nothing to deserve death. The crowd loudly screamed out that they wanted Jesus to die.

Each year they freed one prisoner because of a special holiday. Pilate asked the people who they should free: Barabbas-a thief and murderer, or Jesus, who is called the Christ.

The crowd cheered for Pilate to free Barabbas! So Pilate asked what to do with Jesus. The crowd yelled for Jesus to be killed on a cross. Can you believe it!

The soldiers made a crown out of thorny branches and shoved it on Jesus' head. The sharp points pierced Jesus' head and made Him bleed. They spit on Him, beat Him with a whip, and made fun of Him. After this, they led Him out of the city to be killed.

On the way, the guards saw a man named Simon. He grabbed him and forced him to help carry Jesus' cross.

Lesson Goals

Explain the way to Heaven
Share how much Jesus loves us
Understand why we celebrate Easter

Outside the city, the soldiers nailed Jesus to a cross. They put a sign above Jesus' head which said, "This is the King of the Jews." Two robbers were nailed to crosses beside Jesus, one on the right and the other on the left. After the soldiers nailed Him to the cross, they rolled dice to see who would get His clothes.

Even when Jesus was suffering so much, He asked God to forgive the people that were hurting Him and insulting Him. Can you believe it?

Suddenly, darkness came over all the land. Finally, after much pain and suffering, Jesus died.

That night a rich man named Joseph asked to bury Jesus. He wrapped Jesus' body in a long linen cloth. They took His body and placed it in a cave that was cut out of a wall of rock. They placed a rock over the entrance and sealed it.

At dawn on Sunday, some women walked to Jesus' tomb. When they arrived, they found that the stone was rolled away and Jesus' body was gone! Instantly, two angels told them good news! They said that Jesus was alive! The women ran back to tell the others that Jesus was alive.

The ladies were so excited because they knew that Jesus really was God's Son. He had done something that no one else could do. He died and came back to life! They knew that all Jesus said was really true.

Jesus tells us that He is the only way to Heaven. Jesus died for all the wrong things we have done. He tells us that we can go to Heaven by telling Him we are sorry for our wrongs and trusting in Jesus. If you would like to learn more or know how to ask Jesus into your life, talk to us.

Learning Activities

Try telling the story again by using props or objects. It is fun and the kids can visually see what is going on!

Memory Verse Activities

Place words or phrases of the verse on slips of paper inside plastic eggs. Hide the eggs and let the kids find them and put the verse in order.

Prayer Time

Say a special prayer of thanks for what Jesus did for us. Invite the kids to come to you if they have questions about how to become a Christian.

Snack Time/CleanUp

Eat some delicious treats, have an Easter egg hunt, or make a cute edible Easter scene. Enjoy your time together.

Preschool Lesson

Jesus is Alive!

Easter is such a fun day! Do you know why we celebrate Easter? (Wait for responses, it will help you know how much they know about Easter)

Let's look in the Bible and find out what Easter is. (Open Bible and turn to Luke 24).

The first Easter Sunday happened a long, long, long time ago. Some women went to see where Jesus had been buried. People killed Jesus by putting Him on a cross a few days before Sunday. The ladies were going to put perfumes on Jesus' body.

Believe it or not, they got a BIG surprise! When the women got to the grave, they were shocked! (Gasp, like you are shocked) The grave was open and Jesus' body was gone!

Suddenly, the angel spoke to the women. The angel told them that Jesus was alive! Instantly, two angels told them the good news! Jesus was alive! The women were so excited.

They ran back to tell all Jesus' friends the good news that Jesus wasn't dead any more. He was alive! (make motions like you are running)

The women obeyed and told everyone the good news. Jesus was alive! That is why we celebrate Easter—because Jesus is alive! We must tell our friends this good news like the women did.

Sing fun songs to help the kids remember the Easter story.

Hands-On Activities
for
Jesus is Alive!

Make a special Easter scene with a paper plate or carve out a hole in a cupcake and put a cookie as the stone in front. When the stone is rolled away—it is empty!

To help the kids have a small idea of the suffering Jesus went through, let them hold several pieces of ice in their hands. Put a paper towel under each person's hands to catch the water. Share from the Bible how Jesus was flogged (whipped), beaten, crowned with a thorny wreath, and nailed to a cross. Now, let the kids share how the cold ice felt in their hands and contrast it to Jesus' suffering. Take time to pray, thanking Jesus for suffering and dying for us.

Play the memory game or the floor game to help the children remember what Easter is.

A fun recipe that takes a little planning is the recipe for the Resurrection Cookies. What a treat and they're yummy.

You may have more kids than usual today—be sure to take time to learn everyone's name. Also, this may be the opportunity for someone to trust Christ. Be sensitive.

For preschoolers, bring objects and distinguish whether they are alive or not alive. (Examples may include plants, pictures of people, chair, toys, rocks) Talk about what it means to be alive. Then, share how Jesus came back to life. Explain that we celebrate Easter because Jesus is alive!
