Welcome Time

Have you ever seen something that was unfair? It is easy to want to judge the other person or even say bad things about them. Let's see what Jesus said we should do.

Bible Story

*Please note: This portion of the lesson is given to help in teaching the lesson. Please read through the story and read it in the Bible. Do **NOT** read from this piece of paper. Instead, make a note sheet and place it next to the story in the Bible.*

When Jesus would talk, many times people would come from far away to listen. He shared many lessons about who God is and how much God loves people. People would sit for hours listening to Him.

One day, Jesus was outside talking to many people. He sat down on the side of a mountain and began to teach them many things about the way that they should live.

Then, He said some things that shocked the people. Back in the Old Testament, the Bible tells us that if someone hurts us, we should hurt them back. Jesus told the people that God wanted them NOT to do this. The people stared at Jesus.

Jesus told them to be kind to others, especially their enemies. The crowd did not know what to think. They had NEVER heard anyone say things like this before. They used to take revenge. Now, Jesus is asking them to love and not fight back.

Next, He told him not to judge others. He told the people to not condemn or criticize others. Jesus asked them to forgive others.

He helped them see that we all make mistakes. Jesus said before you see a big problem like a speck of sawdust in a person's eye, you should look at your own life and see the "log of wood" in your eyes. That means that we should look at our own wrongs and fix them, before we try to criticize others' wrongs and mistakes.

Jesus told the people not to be hypocrites. That is a very big word. It means that you say one thing, but do the opposite. For example, a person says they are a Christian who loves God. However, when no one is around, they do things Jesus would be sad about. The person says words, but they have no meaning in their life.

Lesson Goals

Share a way that we can learn to love others and not judge them
Explain why Jesus does not want us to judge others

Jesus wants us to say and do things that please God. He wants our thoughts and words to be kind and helpful to others. This is NOT easy. It is hard being nice to mean people. It is hard to see good in others instead of judging them. Jesus helps us see that God is our judge. He is the one that will judge all people one day. God will always do the right thing.

Some people judged Jesus wrongly too. They did not understand that He was really God's Son. They had a trial and brought in people who lied about Jesus. They judged Him guilty when He was innocent! They made a horrible mistake! They crucified Jesus on a cross. However, this is not the end! Jesus died, but He died for a special reason. He died to pay the price for all the wrongs WE had done. He traded places with us! Then, He came back to life 3 days later! If we believe in Jesus and ask Him to come into our hearts, He will clean out all our sins and make us pure. We do not have to worry about all the wrongs we have done. He has forgiven them. He will stay with us and help us live for God and do things His way. Then, one day, He will take us to heaven. Would you like to know more? Talk to us about it.

Learning Activities

This is a great lesson to apply to our lives. Help the kids "get it."

Memory Verse Activities

Write each word of the verse on cards. Tape each card to various children's backs. Now, let the remainder of the kids put the verse in order.

Prayer Time

Ask God to help us not to judge others this week. It will really take some practice to show love and kindness instead of judgment. Ask for help from God.

Snack Time/CleanUp

Share snacks together.

Don't Judge Others

(Teachers, we will focus on being kind. Judging is a concept the kids will not quite understand yet.)

Hands-on Activities For Don't Judge Others

Illustrate a hypocrite by bringing a piece of good fruit and bad fruit (the bad fruit should look good on the outside but bad on the inside). Peel or cut the fruit so that the kids can see both. Share how a hypocrite looks good on the outside but is rotten on the inside. Share how God wants us to be good fruit.

Everyone has had a time when we have criticized others. One old Indian statement says that we should walk in their shoes before we criticize them. That means that we may not know what has been going on their situation. We should look at that before we judge them. Bring all kinds of fun old shoes to class. Let the kids try to walk around in the shoes. Be sure to bring ladies high heels, little baby shoes etc. Share how hard it is to walk in the shoes. Explain that we should not judge others because we do not know what has happened in their situation.

Try this as a great way to talk about judging others. Bring lots of snacks. As you pass out snacks, give some kids huge portions and others very small portions. Very quickly, the kids will say "that's not fair!" What a great teaching opportunity. Share how we should not judge others. Help them see that we should be glad for what we have and not look or criticize others. (It would probably be best to then add snacks to the very small portion people)

Bring tongue depressors for everyone. Press the stick in your mouth and help the kids remember to watch what they say. Remind them to say kind words to others.

Bring a magnifying glass and remind the kids that we should take the log of wood out of our eyes before we take the speck of dust out of someone else's eyes.

Bring cookies and break each one into two pieces. Give a broken cookie to each person. Each child must help another child mend their cookie with icing. Share how we must mend our harsh words and instead say kind words to others.
