Welcome Time

Ask the kids what it feels like to have someone come to visit them. Most will agree that it is fun and exciting to have visitors come to see you. Share that today's lesson is about this.

Bible Story

*Please note: This portion of the lesson is given to help in teaching the lesson. Please read through the story and read it in the Bible. Do **NOT** read from this piece of paper. Instead, make a note sheet and place it next to the story in the Bible.*

Jesus had 12 special friends or helpers that walked with Him everywhere He went. They listened to Him and learned from Him. Their names were: Peter, Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Thomas, Matthew, James Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon, and Judas.

Jesus told His friends to go to the towns and tell the people about Jesus and Heaven. He told them that they would be able to make people well and help them with their needs. Jesus also told His friends not to worry about what to take with them. He asked them not to take any money with them or even any food. Jesus knew that someone in the town would be kind and let them sleep in their home and give them food to eat. Jesus asked them to say kind words to those who let them spend the night in their homes.

Jesus helped them know that they did not need to be afraid. He told them that God cared for them. He helped them know that they could depend on God for all their needs.

He asked His friends not to be shy about telling others about Jesus and Heaven. He told them that they should be proud to believe in Jesus and tell others. He told them that telling people about Jesus is like giving them a cup of cool water on a hot, dry day. (Mat. 10:42)

Have you ever told someone about Jesus? Do you know what to say? Let's go over it.

God loves us so much. He cares so much that He wants us to be in Heaven with Him one day. The problem is that we have dirty hearts. That means we have done something wrong or thought something wrong etc. That is called sin. Because we have all sinned, we cannot be in Heaven with God because He is clean and pure.

God knew only one way to solve this problem. His Son, Jesus, took our punishment for all the wrongs that we have done. He did this by dying on a cross. Jesus could take our punishment because He was also clean and pure. He got punished for the bad things WE have done. Why? Jesus knew that if we believe in Him and trust that He died and came back to

life for us, we could go to Heaven. How? When we believe in Jesus, He cleans our hearts and makes us pure. We are not dirty anymore! So, we can be with God one day.

How do you believe in Jesus? A person must believe that Jesus died and came back to life to help them get to heaven. He must tell God he is sorry for all the wrong things he has done and ask Jesus to come into his life. Jesus comes into our life and changes us to be like Him—doing what is right and good.

Some people wonder what happens when we do wrong again. Jesus tells us that we must come to God and tell Him we are sorry for the wrong we did and try not to do it again.

Have you asked Jesus into your heart? We can talk about it anytime. Would you like to help someone else know about Jesus? We can show you what to do.

**Learning Activities**

Try ideas to help the kids learn what it means to tell others about Jesus.

**Memory Verse  
Activities**

Play Hopscotch to learn the verse. Hop once for each word of the verse.  
Talk about how we can always depend on God.

**Prayer Time**

Ask God to help us share Jesus with someone we know this week.

**Snack Time/CleanUp**

Clean up and give out snacks. This is a great time to answer questions and help the kids know how they can trust in Jesus.

## Hands-on Activities For Jesus' friends tell others about Him

Make paper sandals to remind the kids to tell others about Jesus.

Make cards to send to people who haven't come in a while. Mail the cards of encouragement to the kids and see who comes next week!

Make a list of kids who have not attended Bible study or church in a while. Separate the kids into groups and ask them to visit the kids and invite them to come to church now!

Draw a map of your apartment complex and/or surrounding area. Place it on the wall. Cut out footprint shapes for each child and label them with their names. Blindfold one child and let them stick their footprint on the map (put tape on the back of the footprint). After everyone's footprint is on the map, explain how each child can go out like the people in today's story and tell ALL the people about Jesus!

Invite the kids to go visiting with you this week. Let them go with you to knock on doors. Let them see how you knock on doors and invite people to church. This is a great way to teach by example.

Jesus talked about how telling others about Jesus is like giving them a cool drink of water. Bring bottled water and replace the label with the phrase, "Tell others about Jesus" or something similar.
